Responding to a call from our Indigenous colleagues, collaborators, and neighbors, Baltimore Center Stage is working toward building meaningful and accountable relationships with the land we occupy. As a first step on this path, you'll see a land acknowledgement in each of our programs. Acknowledgement is itself a small gesture, and we look forward to continuing our efforts toward decolonization in a meaningful way. #### Welcome Friends and Family,

I hope this holiday season finds you blessed and highly favored.

Our first reading comes from 1 Corinthians 13:4-7, and it simply says:
Love is patient; love is kind. It does not envy; it does not boast; it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, and always perseveres.

The word of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God. You may be seated.

Welcome to Arts Centric's production of Langston Hughes' *Black Nativity* at Baltimore Center Stage. Welcome to a place of love where all our differences are looked at fondly and wrapped in acceptance. No matter your denomination, church home, or spiritual connection to a higher being, we all exist to love and be loved. Right?

Turn to your neighbor and say, "Happy Holidays. Hove you. Welcome Home."

I'm often asked why we chose to present Black Nativity this season. The answer is simple... We wanted to come home. This holiday season, we wanted to sit with all of you, our family, and talk and sing and dance. We wanted to gather with all of you in one space and remind you just how much we love you. We wanted to come home.

Wouldn't the world be a much better place if we all took the time to love our neighbor just because it was the right thing to do? Wouldn't it be nice to know that no matter our faults and mistakes, our fellow man would always forgive us? Wouldn't it be nice to know that no matter where you are in the world, you would be welcomed home?

In 1961, Langston Hughes wrote *Black Nativity* as a reminder to the world that this is possible. Act One is set in biblical times to remind us of the persecutions and rejections we often place on each other. He shows us arduous

travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem—the rejections Mary and Joseph faced before giving birth to the Savior on a bed of straw. He then leaps forward two thousand years to remind us that forgiveness and joy are eternal. Act Two he sets us down in a present-day service and gives you, our family, a chance to reflect on just how good it is to be forgiven, seen, and loved.

We all pass judgment. We all cast aside. We all turn a blind eye. Yet, no matter how much time has passed, we can all humble ourselves and forgive or be forgiven. You need not be religious to understand that we all have the power to make someone's day better. No matter how large or small the gesture, we can create positive change. We can build homes in our communities where anyone is welcomed. We can stand with those who are unlike ourselves and love without limits. It's a beautiful thing to know that theatre can serve as a reminder of that.

Yes, there are lights, sets, sounds, and costumes, but this is so much more than a production. This room we are all currently sharing is a snapshot of the world we all hope to live in. The songs we are all about to sing are a reminder that we can all share one voice for a better world.

The clapping and shouting we hope you will join us in sharing is a reminder that joy and love are contagious. We can live by the principles of 1 Corinthians 13. We can continually be better people every day. We can love without ceasing. Religious or not, we can see our fellow man and welcome them home. It may sound cliché, but Arts Centric's hope is that this production plays some part in making this world a better place.

As an African American-led organization, ArtsCentric owes it to Langston Hughes to try. As human beings, we simply owe a better world to each other. So come in, sit down, and make yourself at home. We are so glad you're

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

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
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
